
The story of Hilos de Amor AC

In 2003 women started making quilts in Finca Soconusco when a young woman saw quilt squares and asked "Whose hands did this?" She asked if she could learn to sew these beautiful designs along with her mother and sisters. Soon word spread through out the mountains and women began meeting weekly to sew and hear Biblical stories connected to each design. When these women and their families relocated in town they hung their beautiful quilts out to dry after washing them. Their curious neighbors began to ask about them. On June 25, 2005 a meeting was held in the town marketplace for interested women to learn how to sew these designs. As more women joined the group and were invited to participate in the annual café fair and sell their quilts it was time to become a legal non-profit organization. In June 9, 2009 Hilos de Amor became a legal Mexican AC. Since then they have been given space in the town square by the local government to sew and sell the many one-of-a-kind handmade items. In order to sustain the organization, the women put 10% of each sale in their treasury. This money enables them to buy fabric and other supplies for the group as well as pay any legal expenses. Today, the organization includes women from five different communities. Every three years, new officers are elected by the members to run the AC. Members -young and old - meet weekly in the store to learn, sew, share new models and sew them in their homes to sell in their store.


MY NAME IS MARIA



architecture












My Name is Daniela






MY NAME IS IMELDA






MY NAME IS ROSARIO

Her faith in the Lord and commitment to serve whole-heartedly are a blessing to all she encounters.








I AM CRESCENIA

I AM CARMELITA


Carmelita and her daughter

Please pray for Carmelita to be blessed for the work of her hands and that faith will come stich by stich.










